



On the Farm!





Talk with me about...

Read with me!

- 🍎 Cows, pigs, horses, ducks, chickens, geese, and sheep are all farm animals.
- 🍎 The **pond, coop, and pasture** are all special places for the animals that live on the farm.
- 🍎 Farm animals give us **eggs, milk, and wool**.
- 🍎 Farm animals make all kinds of sounds:
Moo! Neigh! Cock-a-doodle-doo!
Oink! Bawk, bawk...
- 🍎 Farmers take care of their animals by **shearing** the sheep and **milking** the goats and cows.
- 🍎 Foods like **fruits and vegetables** grow on the farm. At this time of year, we see **apples, pumpkins, corn, and squash** at the farm stand. These are also called **crops**.
- 🍎 When we pick the food, it's called **harvesting**.
- 🍎 The **farmer** takes care of the farm.
